Turn grocery shopping and gas purchasing into money for your band student's account. For every \$100 in Hy-Vee Gift Cards purchased get \$4.75 deposited into your band student's account.

Here's how it works:

- 1. Drop your order in the Hy-Vee box in the band room.
- 2. Twice monthly the Hy-Vee Card Coordinator aquires and compiles the card orders.
- 3. On Pickup Day meet the Hy-Vee Card Coordinator to pick up your order.
- 4. Use your cards at Hy-Vee as if they were cash.
- 5. A monthly deposit is made into your band student's account equal to 4.75% of your purchased cards.

It's THAT easy!

Roosevelt will host its Winter Band Concert on Thursday, December 12.

The concert will feature the Freshmen, Varsity, Concert, and Symphonic Bands. We will also be joined by the 8th grade future RHS band members. Doors will open at 6:30 pm, and the concert will start at 7:00 pm.

The dress code requirements for ALL band members are located on page 12 of this newsletter. If you are unable to meet these requirements, please contact me several days in advance of the concert so that we can help your student meet the dress code. PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR STUDENTS ADHERE TO THE DRESS CODE! If they are wearing something out of code they will not be allowed to perform in the concert and will not receive credit for the concert. The audience's focus should be on the music the students have worked hard to prepare and not on someone's outfit.

STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO STAY FOR THE DURATION OF THE CONCERT!

This is different than the middle schools. It is because our auditorium is large enough to accommodate the full audience. Students will write a short graded review of each band's performance the day after the concert. It is important we listen to each other and support the other bands. Since high school concerts are so different from middle school concerts, I have included the high school concert expectations below. Please take time to prepare yourself.

Performance Guidelines for Audience Members

The Sioux Falls Schools Fine and Performing Arts Department has a goal to educate their audiences as well as their own students. We have outlined what is widely considered appropriate behavior for audience members at a fine arts performance. We acknowledge that in today's world that there are many types of activities in which our students participate. What may be appropriate at a sporting event may not be appropriate in the performance setting. Please take these suggestions in the spirit that they are given. It will increase everyone's enjoyment of the performance.

A good audience member

- Arrives on time for the performance
- Enters and exits through the non-performers' doors
- Remembers to turn off all electronic devices (cell phones, watches, iPods, etc.) for the duration of the performance
- Is responsible for the appropriate behavior of ALL children (some performances may not be suitable for ANY children)
- Remains seated with feet on the floor for the entire performance
- Leaves his/her seat only in an emergency and returns at intermission or at an appropriate break in performance
- Remains quiet (no talking, please) and attentive during the performance and avoids creating unnecessary noises (paper wrappers from candy/gum, cough drops, breath mints, etc.)
- Does not try to distract the performer by waving, calling out, fanning one's self, or any other inappropriate gesturing
- Requests permission before using flash photography
- Does not consume food or drink in theaters or concert halls
- Uses appropriate receptacles for disposal of waste
- Shows his/her appreciation by applauding at the end of the performance

Concert Dress

Concert Attire: All Bands

Boys: White long-sleeved dress shirt

Black bow tie (tux type)

Black dress slacks (absolutely no jeans or off-color pants)

Black sport coat (preferable) or black Cardigan sweater

Black dress shoes and black socks

Girls: Black full length dress pants only, <u>no skirts or dresses will be allowed</u>.



Black blouse (see below for two appropriate examples)





Black dress socks & solid BLACK closed toe flat dress shoes.



<u>Ladies: Shoulders and midriff must be covered, no low necklines allowed</u>. Modest black jewelry is allowed. No oversized earrings, colored belts, or tennis shoes allowed.

Pride can be shown through appearance. The attire is more formal since giving a concert is a more formal event. Any deviation from the above standard will result in dismissal from the performance. If you think that your outfit does not meet the standard DO NOT WEAR IT. Please do not put the directors and organization in an awkward position by not wearing the appropriate concert attire. **PARENTS we need your help in ensuring that the correct attire is worn at our performances.**
